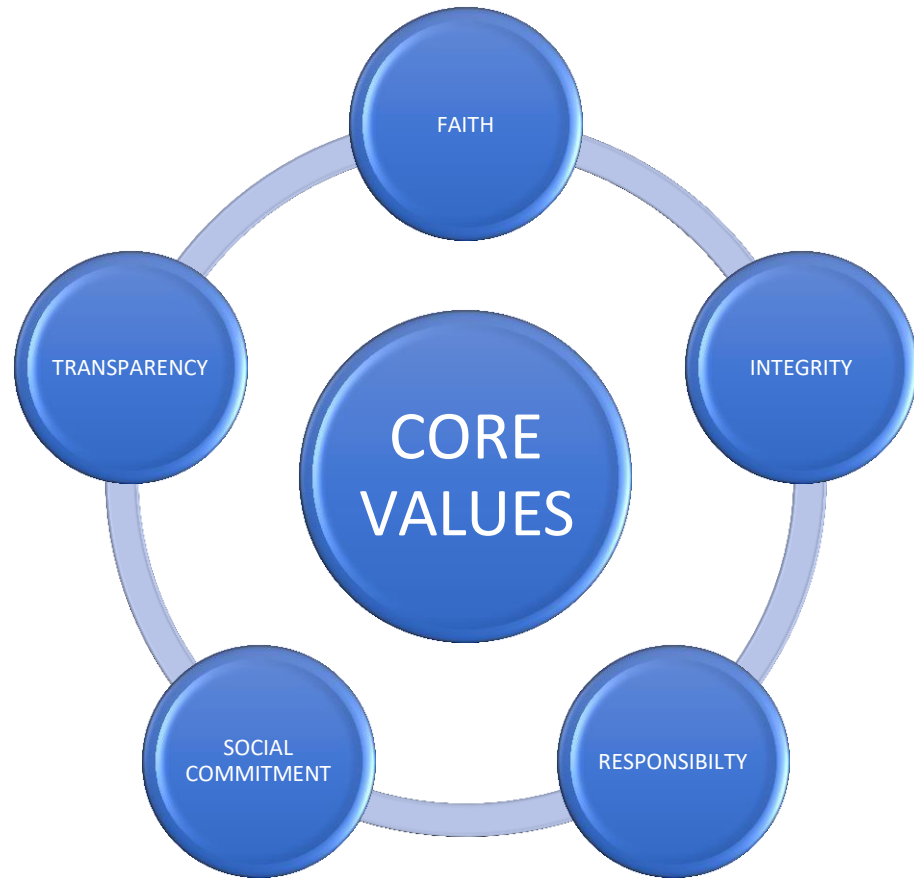

OUR CURRICULUM

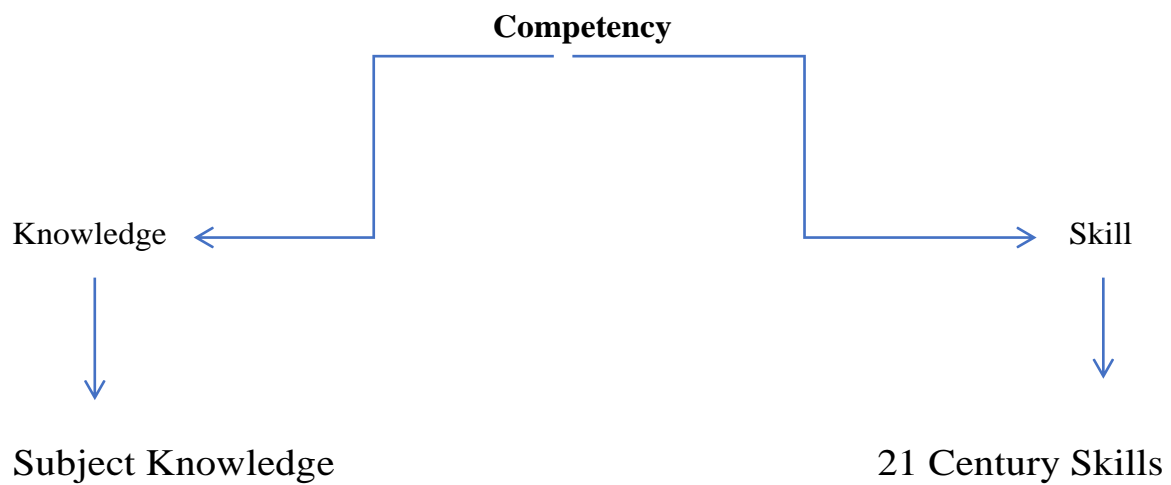

RULES AND REGULATIONS

ADMISSION

- All students seeking admission from Kindergarten to Grade IX are selected on the basis of merit and the number of seats available.
- The application forms for admission can be collected from the school office once the admission dates are announced.
- At the time of admission, the student should be personally introduced by the parent or guardian who will be responsible to the school authorities for his/her studies and conduct.
- At the time of admission, students are required to undergo Academic Interactive counseling as part of the admission process. KG students and students from grade 1 and 2 have to attend an interactive counseling session with stimulating activities while students seeking admission for grade 3 and above are required to attend Academic Awareness Aptitude (AAA) along with an interactive session.
- The students are also required to meet Principal with their parents once they clear the preliminary round.

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is required for every student.

- Attendance on opening day and closing day of every semester is compulsory.
- No student should be absent from class without sufficient reason.
- Parents/ Guardians must clearly state the reason for the absence in the Leave Application.
- Students are not allowed to go out of the campus during school hours, including recess time.
- Those students who take leave without prior permission shall not enter the class without the Principal's permission.
- Students are not allowed to be absent on the first day of opening and closing days of long breaks or special holidays.
- Unauthorized absence of more than 15 days will lead to removal from the rolls.
- Students suffering from contagious diseases will not be permitted to attend school.

UNIFORM

- The school uniform is obligatory on all school days and at official functions. It is the duty of the parents/guardians to see that students come to school neatly dressed in the prescribed school uniform.
- Students should come to school in normal uniform on all weekdays except Wednesday and Saturday.
- Students should come to school in house uniform on all Wednesdays.
- Students should wear PT uniforms on all Saturdays.
- Students should come to school neatly and cleanly dressed.
- No accessories of any kind are to be used, except for simple earrings, black ribbons, and black hair clips for girls. No gold jewelry, bangle, and flowers will be permitted.
- Boys should have short haircut
- Shoes should be polished daily.

DISCIPLINE

Discipline is an integral part of the learning process. To develop self-control, a student must be trained to bridle emotions and impulses, to live in harmony with others, to respect family traditions, to keep the laws of the country, and to obey the commandments of God.

- All students shall be on the school premises at 8.45 am, 5 minutes before the morning bell, and taking part in the refreshing meditation and solemn morning assembly in an orderly and respectful manner. Classes will commence after daily prayers

- In the afternoon, students should be in their classrooms after the first bell and maintain silence during the prayer.
- Each student must bring student's handbook to school every day and have it with them in every class.
- The school expects students to be polite, friendly and well behaved in and outside the school. They should be respectful to their elders and teachers, and considerate to their juniors; honest and truthful at all times.
- Students shall keep silence and decorum in the classrooms and corridors.
- Students shall not leave their classrooms or enter other classrooms without permission.
- Students are not allowed to enter the teacher's staff room without permission or in the absence of any teacher.
- English is the mode of communication within the school premises.
- The school premises and classrooms must be kept neat.
- Any damage caused to the property of the school or of other students must be reported to the Principal and will have to be compensated.
- Students shall be responsible for the safe custody of their belonging. It is suggested that the students' names must be inscribed on all articles such as uniforms, shoes, lunch boxes, umbrellas, and boxes.
- The school is a plastic -free zone and does not promote students bringing and using single-use plastic.
- Every student shall endeavor to keep up the high standard of the school by excelling in studies, good manners, and deportment/personal conduct.
- Politeness and courtesy in speech and conduct as well as cleanliness and grace of person are to be cultivated and cherished.
- Students are expected to behave with dignity outside the school premises also. Any activities of the student outside the school premises or in public places, which may harm the name, reputation, and discipline of the School will be addressed and disciplinary action will be initiated if found necessary.
- While wearing the school uniform, no student must engage in behaviour or associations detrimental to the moral tone, values and goodwill of the school. Strict disciplinary action will be initiated against the student found engaging in the same.
- Students are discouraged from carrying too much money or any expensive articles to school.
- Students are not permitted to bring mobile phones , iPods, cameras, laptops and other electronic equipment without the permission of the teacher concerned. If found in possession, the articles will be confiscated.
- All students are sincerely exhorted to cultivate the habit of morning and evening prayer.
- Whenever students are permitted to wear casual clothes, they must be

modestly and suitably attired for school.

- Tuition fees shall be paid in school and through DD with any nationalized bank. Fees can also be paid through the school website using net banking.
 - An admission fee of Rs.10000 will be availed from the students for the first year of enrolment.
 - Uniforms, bus fees, extracurricular activity and text books are exempted from the tuition fees.

FEE REGULATIONS

- School fees must be paid in three installments regularly during the stipulated time allotted for the same.
- Fees can be remitted to the school office via DD.
- Fee receipts must be retained and produced as proof of payment, if necessary. All fee dues must be cleared before a student is permitted to sit for the final examination.
- A fine of Rs. 50 will be levied if the fee installments are not remitted on time. In the event of continued failure to remit fees, a penalty of Rs.5 will be added on every 5th day.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

- Children should be alert and maintain discipline in the bus.
- The school will not provide alternative transport facilities to students who miss the bus.
- At the bus stop, students shall get into the bus in an orderly manner; they should maintain a queue while boarding and alighting the bus. Inside the bus, students should maintain decorum.
- After alighting from the bus, children should wait at the bus stop, till the bus moves. They should be very cautious and see that they cross the road only after the bus has left the stop.
- In case of any complaints, parents should report to the office and never approach the crew of the bus directly.
- Students should be present in their boarding point five minutes prior to the stipulated time. Parents can only contact the drivers if the bus is 15 minutes late.

EXAMINATION:

Examinations aid in testing the reception of knowledge and its application in a practical manner to assess the impact of teaching methodology and learner information absorption. Continuous evaluation and assessment of the child is carried out to challenge the intellectual competency and measure the behavioural and intellectual growth. It also helps teachers and parents to gauge out the true aptitude of each child.

- 4 Periodic Assessments (PA) are conducted within a year. There will be two semesters in the academic year with end semester exams to analyse the progress of each student.
- Subject enrichment activities are conducted throughout the year where the students will be gauged on their subject and language skills.
- No child will be promoted to higher class until he/she qualifies to get promotion.

- Promotion will be based on the continuous comprehensive evaluation conducted throughout the academic year.
- No retest will be given for any examination. If the student is found unable to cope- up with the syllabus he/she will be advised to change the stream.
- Hall tickets will be issued to the students who have cleared their dues at least a week before the examination.

CBSE INSTRUCTIONS

- CBSE registration for students undertaking board exam will be done once the students reach Grade 9.
- Registration process starts in the month of November and all students will be expected to pay the stipulated registration fees without fail.
- All students are expected to have correct names in their Government identification cards such as aadhar card and this name should be provided in school at the time of admission.
- Parents should ensure that their names are documented with correct spelling in all the documents including their wards aadhar cards.
- NCERT syllabus will be followed from grade 8 onwards and students are required to hand in CBSE mandated assignments such as portfolio and subject wise group projects. Internal marks will be allocated to each student according to the completion of required assignments.

WITHDRAWAL

- No school leaving certificate will be issued unless applied for in writing after all the dues have been cleared.

PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

The active co-operation of the parents is an essential pre-requisite for the welfare of the students. Parents are advised to

- Check the Student's handbook daily and sign teacher's remarks if any within the prescribed time.
- Respond to circulars and other communication from the school promptly.
- Supervise the child's daily lessons.
- Ensure that the child has adequate hours of study at home and completes all assignments.
- Encourage the child to participate in all co-curricular activities and school functions.
- Ensure that the child is punctual.
- Take pride in sending the child to school well dressed.
- Parents should compulsorily attend PTM to get an update on the student's academic progress and conduct.
- Intimate any change of phone number or address to the school promptly.
- Participation in talks or seminars arranged by school authorities is compulsory to help and guide parents in fulfilling their parental responsibility in the best possible manner.
- Parents may meet teachers only with the permission of the Principal during recess time.
- Both parents should attend PTM orientations without fail.
- Parents can meet Principal only on Wednesdays and Fridays. No community gathering is allowed inside the Principal's chamber.

HOUSES:

The four distinctive houses namely Manava, Pranava, Satya and Sneha are intricately designed to cultivate sportsman spirit and sense of belongingness amongst the students. The names of the houses were the result of deep introspection, **Manava** essentially means human and emphasizes the importance of humanity within each individual; **Pranava** denotes a form of meditation and symbolizes the need of spirituality in all beings. **Satya**, a cosmic sound stands for unity and universality, stands for truth and signifies how honesty is one of the most important virtues that a human being should exhibit; **Sneha** stands for friendship and connotes how humans are social beings, it also represents the solidarity and fraternity between all human beings.
