11. DISCIPLINE AND ETIQUETTES

The four areas of discipline focused by CMI Vision of Education are as follows: HOME DISCIPLINE, PERSONAL DISCIPLINE, CLASSROOM DISCIPLINE and SCHOOL DISCIPLINE. Discipline and personal hygienic follow-ups were given much importance through various methods. Students

were given strict instructions to walk only in line while moving outside the classroom. During assembly time students' uniforms, shoes, nails, and hairstyles are checked. Inside the classroom, theme of the year is written on the board. Various paper activities are displayed in the class noticeboard.

12. TEACHERS' PRAYER

Every day Kristu Jayanti CMI Public School begins with seeking the presence of Almighty God. Teachers gather in the Principal's chamber and pray for guidance to mold the students into morally upright citizens of tomorrow.

13. NON-TEACHING STAFF'S PRAYER

This year we have started prayer session for non-teaching staff under the leadership of Rev.Fr. Lijo K.Joy CMI. The prayer session is at 8.45 am at Chavara Hall.

14. MEDITATION

Every day after assembly, a short guided meditation is conducted inside the class to widen the mental and emotional horizon of each child. Meditation helps them clear and refresh their mind. It enables them to absorb knowledge gifted to them each day.

15. ASSEMBLY

Assembly is conducted according to various formats like Class wise assembly, thematic assembly, House wise assembly and JSC Assembly. Every Thursday the entire assembly will be conducted in Hindi. Fourth Saturdays, Jayantians will conduct Kannada Assembly.

To make the assembly interesting and informative, story telling, puzzles, quotes, quiz activities were conducted and those who perform well in the activities will be awarded with special prizes. Importance of the day is depicted in a more innovative way by the students.

16. PHYSICAL EDUCATION

During the morning assembly, all the Jayantians undergo a warm up session with many exercises. HPE is done for Grade IX and X as per CBSE rules.

17. YOGA

Yoga is taught in all the classes. PE / Yoga periods are allocated for every section. A special Yoga room is set and jayantians are provided with yoga mat facility inside the yoga room. The Yoga demonstrations are shown in Morning Assembly programme on the Yoga Day.

18. DEPARTMENT OF HOSPITALITY & RECEPTION

This department takes care of the hospitality to be shown when guests are invited. The guests of honour are treated with high respect and adorned with garlands. Ushering girls are trained in such a way that they manage all the related activities when the guest arrives. They will be taken to the guests' room and serves snacks. The guests were asked to write the remarks in the book provided for getting their feedback.

19. COUNSELLING

Ms. Rinu Anna Thomas, the Academic Counsellor, takes care of weak and differently abled children and guide them to come up in their performance. This is done for Grade III above.

20. SPECIAL CLASSES

Grades 9 and 10 are provided special classes in the morning before regular class hours and from 3.50 to 4.45 pm to aid them with their preparation for the board exams.

21. SEMESTER INDEX

This programme focuses on the progress of the school in various aspects. As part of this, all the teachers prepared and presented PPT on evaluation of their own respective departments for first semester. This helps the school to plan for the next academic semester.

22. JAYANTIAN MEDIA

Jayantian Media takes care of all the recordings of the school. Main programmes are recorded and sent to the class groups.

23. PERSONAL MEETING

All the teachers will be called at the Principal's office individually and discuss the pros and cons of classroom management and teaching methodologies. Effective guidelines are provided by the Principal for the betterment of students and teachers.

24. TEACHERS' MEETINGS

Before every programme, meetings will be held by the in-charge teachers and guidelines will be given for the effective completion of the programmes in the best possible way.

25. VISUAL TEACHING THROUGH INTERACTIVE INSTRUCTIONAL PANEL BOARD

The classroom teaching was made effective through a special interactive board called IIP, which enhanced the teaching process by providing audio and visual reinforcement. Through this teachers can access net connection and show live videos for better understanding. This makes learning 4 dimensional and enjoyable.

26. CBSE ACTIVITIES

Every week periods are allocated for the students to do CBSE activities, such as ART INTEGRATED PROECT and other activities given from time to time.

1) SWACHHATA HI SEWA

On 15th August 2014, speaking from the Ramparts of the Red Fort, Hon'ble Prime Minister gave a clarion call for Swachhata to become a national priority and to achieve it through jan bhagidaari. Subsequently, the Swachh Bharat Mission was launched on 2nd October 2014 under a 'Whole of Government' approach, making sanitation 'everyone's business'. Thereafter, the whole world saw, as the nation came together and created what is known as the world's largest jan andolan for swachhata. As part of this, CBSE announced the activities to be conducted and it started on 17th September and concluded on 2nd October, 2024 at Kristu Jayanti CMI Public School.

2) ART INTEGRATED PROJECT

As part of CBSE's Art Integrated Project, a comparative study of KARNATA and LADAKH was opted and students engaged in various activities as per the guidelines given by CBSE.

3) BHARATIYA BHASHA UTSAV 2024

On the Birth Anniversary of Mahakavi Subhamanya Bharati, on 11th December various activities were held based on the theme 'Unity through Languages'

In line with this, our school organized a **Multilingual Festival** from 4th December to 11th December 2024. The event featured a variety of language-based activities, including speeches, slogan writing, poetry translation, placard-making, storytelling, cookbook creation, costume

presentation and greeting presentations. A highlight of the program was "Bhasha Mithra", which inspired great enthusiasm among the students.

4) CBSE SURVY

On 4th December, a general awareness examination was conducted with Grade 6 students as part of the survey. They were given OMR sheets to answer the questions. The topic covered were Language and General Awareness. 30 students participated and 2 invigilators of CBSE supervised the examination.

33. HEALTH AND WELLNESS ACTIVITIES

1) MEDIFINE TEEN-MEDICAL & HEALTH ASSESSMENT PROGRAMME

A medical camp was organised at Kristu Jayanti CMI Public School as part of our Medical & Health Assessment Programme and Dr.Praveen from the Government Hospital visited and did eye check-up and general health check-up of all the Jayantians. 34. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1) KRIS NEWS

This channel enables everyone to know the news updates at Kristu Jayanti CMI Public School. The programme details are narrated by 2 students and uploaded in this channel.

2) RADIO NOON

Radio Noon programme airs every Wednesday which is designed to foster good communication skills and bring students together through engaging conversations and updates.

On June 26, Radio Noon programme was hosted by Jayantian Jeevan Aradhya and Jayashree of grade IX. This initiative aimed to enhance the students' communication skills and by all accounts, they did an excellent job.

They shared news headlines, updates on environmental day celebration and talked about the importance of raising awareness and combating drug abuse. Many listeners appreciated their efforts, despite some technical issues with the sound system. Overall, it was a successful event that helped boost the students' confidence in public speaking.

3) FIRST BELL READ WELL

Reading is a fundamental skill essential for acquiring knowledge and mastering other abilities. To achieve excellence, cultivating reading habits from an early age is crucial. With this vision, on 2nd January 2024, a language development program titled "First Bell Read Well" was launched, inspired

by the concept "Reading is my passion, action, and reflection," to enhance the reading skills of Jayantians.

4) WE FLUENCE: COMMUNICATION SKILL PROGRAMME

A communication skill programme started to develop the ability to narrate stories on stage as well as in the classes by students from Grades I to VIII under the guidance of the Academic Coordinator Ms.Kakali Bhattacharyya. Students from various grades will perform stories on stage during assembly days. On other days, the students will be taken to different classes and narrate the stories. For Grade I to IV, Ms. Sharon D'Cruz is in-charge and Grade V to VIII in-charge teacher is Ms. Ajishya.

5) VOX PUPILI – READING COMPETITION

Vox Pupili, the reading competition has started to encourage the students from Grade I to VIII to improve their reading skills. It will be conducted in 5 rounds. The best readers will be awarded trophies and certificates during Pathakkam Ceremony.

6) WORD WAR

The Word War Championship, a prestigious contest aimed at enhancing vocabulary skills, unfolded across five seasons, each marked by intense competition and linguistic prowess. The word war, the vocabulary power contest was organised for the better learning of language skills and the development of word power among students. 1. MODEL EXAMINATIONS

For Grade IX and X, model examinations are conducted on regular basis. The marks have been evaluated and intimated to the Parents via PTM.

2. PERIODIC ASSESSMENTS

For Grades VI to VIII, 4 PA's are conducted. Marks are evaluated and intimated to the parents through PTM. Parents' feed backs are recorded and effective remedial measures are taken by the Principal for the improvement of Jayantians.

3. CLASS TEST

For all the grades monthly Class Tests are conducted regularly to assess their regular performances and remedial measures are taken, if necessary.

4. UNIT TEST

For Grades I to V monthly Unit Tests are conducted and marks are recorded in the software. PTM meetings are arranged after the Unit Test.

5. RRT

Revision tests are mandatory for the betterment of students. The revision test before the Semester Examination RRT was conducted for all the classes and the papers were distributed to the students and results were given to the CoE.

6. MICRO TEST

A new examination pattern has introduced this year to assess the performance of the students. The question paper will be displayed on the panel board and the students will write in paper.

7. SEMESTER EXAMINATION

First semester exam began on 1st October, 2024. During the examination days it was declared half day for the students. Teachers were given correction duties in the afternoon.

Examinations are conducted as per the curriculum to test the improvement in the academics. The pattern of question are based on BLOOMS TAXONOMY. Continuous evaluation and assessment of the child are carried out to challenge intellectual competency and measure behavioural and intellectual growth. It also helps teachers and parents gouge the true aptitude of each child.
