Class IX & X is a composite course. Students therefore should take only those subjects in class IX with they intend to continue in Class X. Subjects can be offered as under:



RULES AND REGULATIONS

ADMISSION

- All students seeking admission from Kindergarten to Grade IX are selected on the basis of merit and the number of seats available.
- The application forms for admission can be collected from the school office once the admission dates are announced.
- At the time of admission, the student should be personally introduced by the parent or guardian who will be responsible to the school authorities for his/her studies and conduct.
- At the time of admission, students are required to undergo Academic Interactive Counseling as part of the admission process. KG students and students from grade 1 and 2 have to attend an interactive counseling session with stimulating activities while students seeking admission for grade 3 and above are required to attend Academic Awareness Aptitude (AAA) along with an interactive session.
- The students are also required to meet Principal with their parents once they clear the preliminary round.

ZONED STRUCTURE WITHIN THE SCHOOL

It is an innovative approach to cater the needs of Jayantians at all stages of their growth and development.

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is required for every student.

- Attendance on opening day and closing day of every semester is compulsory.
- No student should be absent from class without sufficient reason.
- Parents/ Guardians must clearly state the reason for the absence in the Leave Application.
- Students are not allowed to go out of the campus during school hours, including recess time.
- Those students who take leave without prior permission shall not enter the class without the Principal's permission.
- Students are not allowed to be absent on the first day of opening and closing days of long breaks or special holidays.
- Unauthorized absence of more than 15 days will lead to removal from the rolls.
- Students suffering from contagious diseases will not be permitted to attend school.
- A minimum of 60% attendance per Semester is mandatory to be eligible for writing the Semester Examinations.

UNIFORM


- The school uniform is obligatory on all school days and at official functions. It is the duty of the parents/guardians to see that students come to school neatly dressed in the prescribed school uniform.
- Students should come to school in normal uniform on all weekdays except Wednesday and Saturday.
- Students should come to school in house uniform on all Saturdays.
- Students should wear PT uniforms on all Wednesdays.
- Students should come to school tidily.
- No accessories of any kind are to be used, except for simple earrings, black ribbons, and black hair clips for girls. No gold jewelry, bangle, and flowers will be permitted.
- Students should use the winter coat provided from school. No other winter coat is allowed.
- Hairstyle shall be treated as part of the school uniform.





1. Hold the wide end of the tie in your right hand and the narrow end in your left




2. Cross the wide end over the narrow end.

DISCIPLINE

Discipline is an integral part of the learning process. To develop self-control, a student must be trained to bridle emotions and impulses, to live in harmony with others, to respect family traditions, to keep the laws of the country, and to obey the commandments of God.

- All students shall be on the school premises at 8.45 am, 5 minutes before the morning bell, and taking part in the refreshing meditation and solemn morning assembly in an orderly and respectful manner. Classes will commence after daily prayers.
- In the afternoon, students should be in their classrooms after the first bell and maintain silence during the prayer.
- Each student must bring student's handbook to school every day and have it with them in every class.
- The school expects students to be polite, friendly and well behaved in and outside the school. They should be respectful to their elders and teachers, and considerate to their juniors; honest and truthful at all times.
- Students shall keep silence and decorum in the classrooms and corridors.
- Students shall not leave their classrooms or enter other classrooms without permission.
- Students are not allowed to enter the teacher's staff room without permission or in the absence of any teacher.
- English is the mode of communication within the school premises.
- The school premises and classrooms must be kept neatly.
- Any damage caused to the property of the school or of other students must be reported to the Principal and will have to be compensated.
- Students shall be responsible for the safe custody of their belonging. It is suggested that the students' names must be inscribed on all articles such as uniforms, shoes, lunch boxes, umbrellas, and boxes.
- The school is a plastic -free zone and does not promote students bringing and using single-use plastic.
- Every student shall endeavor to keep up the high standard of the school by excelling in studies, good manners, and deportment/personal conduct.
- Politeness and courtesy in speech and conduct as well as cleanliness and grace of person are to be cultivated and cherished.

- While wearing the school uniform, no student must engage in behaviour or associations detrimental to the moral tone, values and goodwill of the school. Strict disciplinary action will be initiated against the student found engaging in the same.
- Students are discouraged from carrying too much money or any expensive articles to school.
- Students are not permitted to bring mobile phones, iPods, cameras, laptops and other electronic equipment without the permission of the teacher concerned. If found in possession, the articles will be confiscated.
- All students are sincerely exhorted to cultivate the habit of morning and evening prayer.
- Whenever students are permitted to wear casual clothes, they must be modestly and suitably attired for school.
- Jayantians are permitted to wear colour dress on their birthdays and children's day.
- Distribution of sweets on birthdays are not permitted.

Tuition fees shall be paid in school and through DD with any nationalized bank fees can also be paid through the school website using net banking.

An admission fee of Rs. 15,000 will be availed from the students for the first year of enrolment.

Tuition fees do not include the fees for Uniforms, Bus, Extracurricular Activity (ECA) and Text books.

FEE REGULATIONS

- School fees must be paid in three installments regularly during the stipulated time allotted for the same.
- Fees can be remitted to the school office via DD.
- Fee receipts must be retained and produced as proof of payment, if necessary. All fee dues must be cleared for a student to be permitted to write the final examination.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

- Students should be alert and maintain discipline in the bus.
- The school will not provide alternative transport facilities to students who miss the bus.
- At the bus stop, students shall get into the bus in an orderly manner; they should maintain a queue while boarding and alighting the bus. Students should maintain decorum inside the bus.
- After alighting from the bus, children should wait at the bus stop, till the bus moves. They should be very cautious and see that they cross the road only after the bus has left the stop.
- In case of any complaints, parents should report to the office and never approach the crew of the bus directly.
- Students should be present in their boarding point five minutes prior to the stipulated time.
- Parents can only contact the drivers if the bus is 15 minutes late.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Students are allowed to use only the allotted bus and bus stop. No change will be allowed without prior written permission of the school.
- The buses will not wait for late comers.
- Students should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.
- No student should come near the entry door of the bus until it comes to a complete halt. The front door of the bus is the only authorized entrance and exit.
- No student should travel standing on the footboard.
- Students must not move around on the bus when it is in motion.
- The students must make sure that the aisle of the bus is clear, school bags and other belongings are placed properly.
- Students must not put any part of their body outside the bus. They should not put their hands out even for waving.
- No object should be discarded inside or thrown outside the bus.
- Consumption of edibles is not permitted on buses.
- Unruly behaviour like shrieking, shouting, and playing foul is strictly prohibited.
- Courteous behaviour is expected at all times.
- The driver's attention must not be distracted for any reason.

- The bus monitor on duty is responsible for maintaining discipline in the buses.
- Any serious offense must be reported to the Teacher-In-Charge immediately.
- In case of any change, of a temporary or permanent nature, in transport pick-up /drop point or transport route, permission for the same has to be sought by making an application to the School office.
- Bus services will be discontinued without further notice for children who do not follow bus rules, damage accessories on the bus, or offend passers-by with their actions or words.
- If any student is reported to be throwing objects outside from the school bus, strict disciplinary action will be taken against him/her.
- Respect the window boundary: No body parts protruding. No items were tossed.
- Nothing shouted.
- Respect other fellow commuters personal space: No physical or verbal attacks. No taunts.
- No harassment. No bullying.
- Do not disrupt the driver with your voice or actions.
- Do not tamper with bus controls, emergency exits, or safety equipment.
- Do not bring hazardous or destructive objects (i.e. firearms, weapons, explosives, sharp or pointed objects, lighters, or matches) on the bus.
- Use only polite and elegant language for communication among the students.
- The communication in the bus must be in English.
- Bus will stop only at the boarding point, students will not be allowed to get down from the bus for buying snacks or stationary things.
- If student is not able to board the bus He/she may seek help from nannies.
- After getting down from bus students can help of nannies to cross the road.

EXAMINATION

Examinations aid in testing the reception of knowledge and its application in a practical manner to assess the impact of teaching methodology and learner information absorption. Continuous evaluation and assessment of the child is carried out to challenge the intellectual competency and measure the behavioural and intellectual growth. It also helps teachers and parents to gauge out the true aptitude of each child.

- Periodic Assessments (PA), Comprehensive Competitive Examination(CCE) Class Tests (CT), Resource enabled test and Monthly Assessments are conducted within a year. There will be two semesters in the academic year with end semester exams to analyse the progress of each student.
- Subject enrichment activities are conducted throughout the year where the students will be gauged on their subject and language skills.
- No retest will be given for any examination. If the student is found unable to cope- up with the syllabus he/she will be advised to change the stream.
- Having a hall ticket one week prior to the exam is vital as it ensures students are adequately prepared and have the necessary authorization to participate in the Semester examination.
- LSWR (Listening, Speaking, Writing, Reading) assessments are vital for students as they support the development of language proficiency across all modalities, ensuring effective communication and critical thinking; conducting them monthly provides regular feedback on students' progress and areas for improvement.

Here's a detailed breakdown of the examination schedule for each grade

GRADE I & II

CLASS TEST : Administered monthly to evaluate students' understanding of the material covered during that period.

Monthly Assessment : Conducted monthly to assess students' overall performance in the classroom setting.

GRADE III to VIII

CLASS TEST : Held once in a month to gauge students' comprehension and progress.

PA (Periodic Assessment): Three PA exams are conducted throughout the academic year to evaluate students' understanding across various subjects.

Comprehensive Competitive Examination : Held in first semester. This examination is a multiple - choice test designed to encourage competitive spirit, foster learning, and identify areas for further improvement in core subjects.

Resource-Enabled Exam : It is an assessment format that allows students to refer to various learning materials while answering questions. This can include textbooks, notes, online resources, and other academic references. The focus of this exam type is not just on rote memorization but on the ability to analyze, apply, and synthesize information effectively.

GRADE IX

UNIT TEST : Three unit tests are administered throughout the year to assess understanding of individual units or topics.

PT (Periodic Test) : Two comprehensive exams are held at regular intervals to monitor students' overall progress.

MODEL EXAM : One model exam is conducted to simulate the format and difficulty level of the final assessment.

ANNUAL EXAM : The culminating exam at the end of the academic year, covering all topics studied.

GRADE X


UNIT TEST : Three unit tests are conducted periodically to assess students' understanding of specific units or topics.

QUESTION PAPER PATTERN OF EXAMINATION

Our question paper pattern is designed based on Bloom's Taxonomy, ensuring a balanced assessment of students' knowledge, comprehension, and critical thinking skills. The exam will include a mix of recall-based, conceptual, application-oriented, and higher-order thinking questions to promote holistic learning. This approach helps students develop problem-solving skills, creativity, and the ability to analyze and evaluate information effectively. By following Bloom's Taxonomy, we aim to enhance students' cognitive abilities and prepare them for real-world challenges beyond academics.



CBSE INSTRUCTIONS

- CBSE registration for students undertaking board exam will be done once the students reach Grade 9.
 - Registration process starts in the month of August and all students will be expected to pay the stipulated registration fees without fail.
 - All students are expected to have correct names in their Government identification cards such as Adhar card, Birth Certificate and the name should be provided in school at the time of admission.
 - Parents should ensure that their names are documented with correct spelling in all the documents including their wards aadhar cards.

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


