25 Learning Blocks, aligned with national board guidelines and research-based international standards.

Block 1 	Understanding Characters Student understands that a character's actions can give us clues about what the character is like.	Block 2 	Describing a Person Student understands that we can use describing words to describe what a person says, does, and looks like.
Block 3 	Sequence of Events Student understands that a story has a clear sequence of events with a beginning, middle, and end.	Block 4 	Writing a Story Student understands that all stories are made up of characters, settings, and events.
Block 5 	Imagery Student understands that a poet can use descriptive imagery to create a picture in the reader's mind.	Block 6 	Realistic and Imaginary Student understands the difference between realistic and imaginary elements of a poem/story.
Block 7 	Writing a Fantasy Story Student understands that a fantasy story includes some imaginary characters, settings and/or events.	Block 8 	Learning through Fables Student understands that a fable is a short story, usually with animal characters, and has a moral.
Block 9 	Text-to-Text Connections Student understands that making connections to a familiar text can help us to understand a new text.	Block 10 	Comparing Folktales Student understands that we can compare texts of the same genre to identify genre-specific elements.
Block 11 	Problem-Solution Poems Student understands that many sounds have more than one spelling in English.	Block 12 	Visualising Student understands that details from the five senses can help to describe a place.

Block 13 	Making Comparisons Student understands that comparing and contrasting stories with his/her own life helps understand stories better.	Block 14 	Finding the Main Idea Student understands that every story has a main idea that tells us what it is all about.
Block 15 	Compound Sentences Student understands that we can use both simple and compound sentences to make our writing more interesting.	Block 16 	Asking Questions Student understands that asking and answering questions can help us to read a story.
Block 17 	Writing about the Future Student understands that the words will and will not are used to write about promises and plans for the future.	Block 18 	Giving Instructions Student understands that every process has a series of steps and specific language and style is used to communicate those steps.
Block 19 	Text-to-Self Connections Student understands that making text-to-self connections helps in understanding the story.	Block 20 	Writing with Adverbs Student understands that adverbs help in describing actions better.
Block 21 	Facts and Opinions Student understands the difference between facts and opinions in a piece of writing.	Block 22 	Persuasive Writing Student understands that we can write an opinion essay to give our views on a topic.
